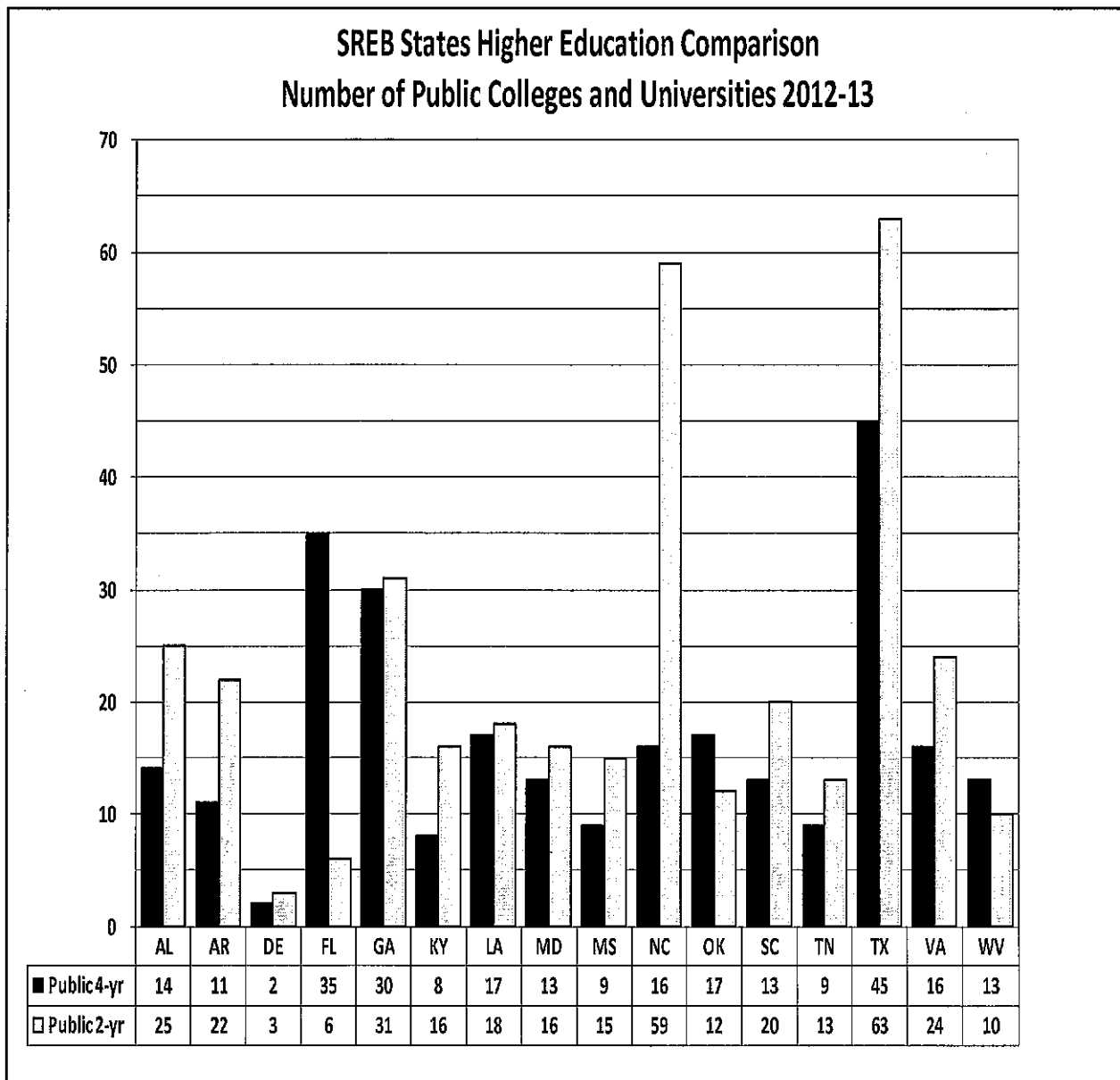

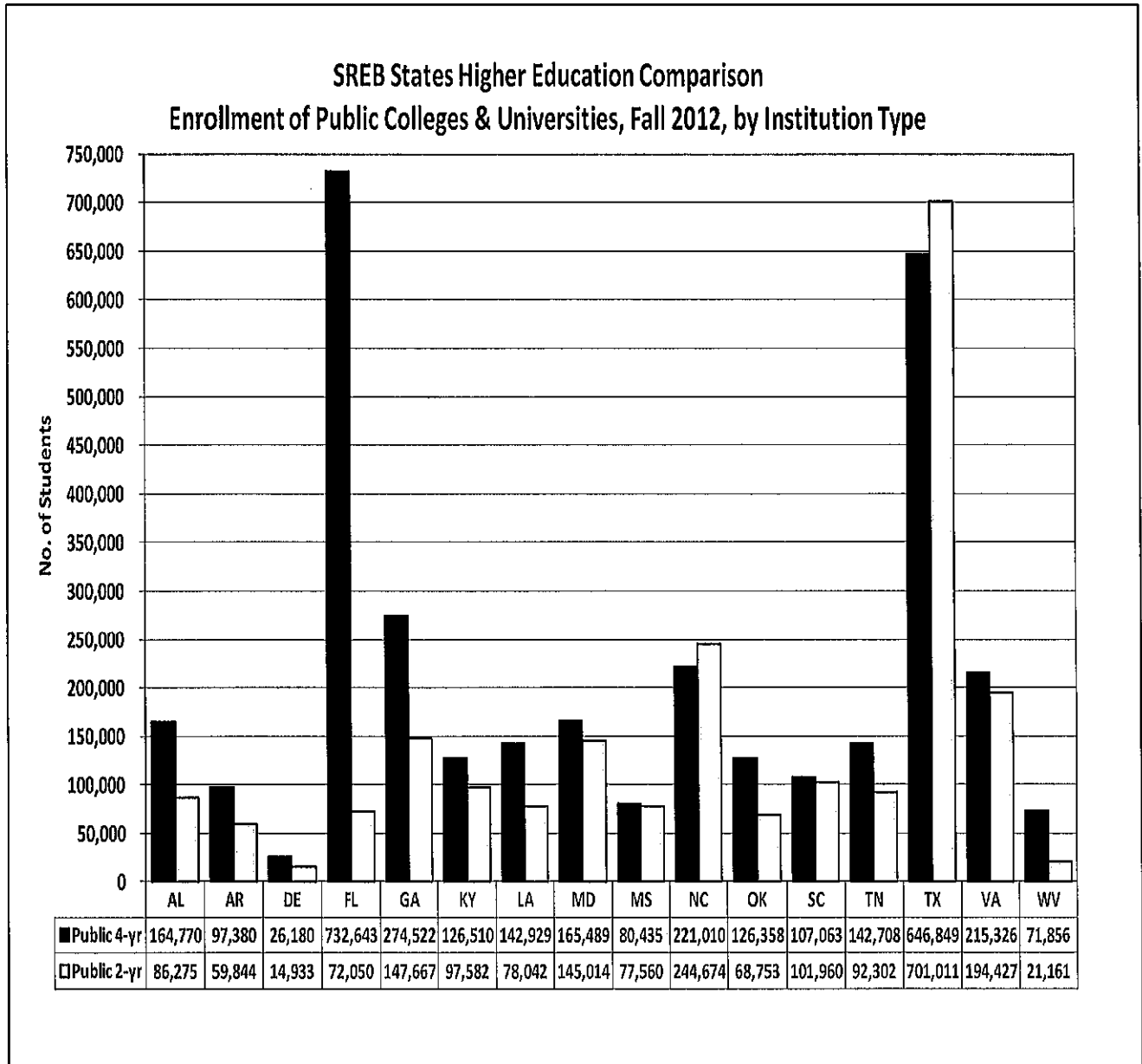


Enrollment of Colleges and Universities, Fall 2012, by Institution Type

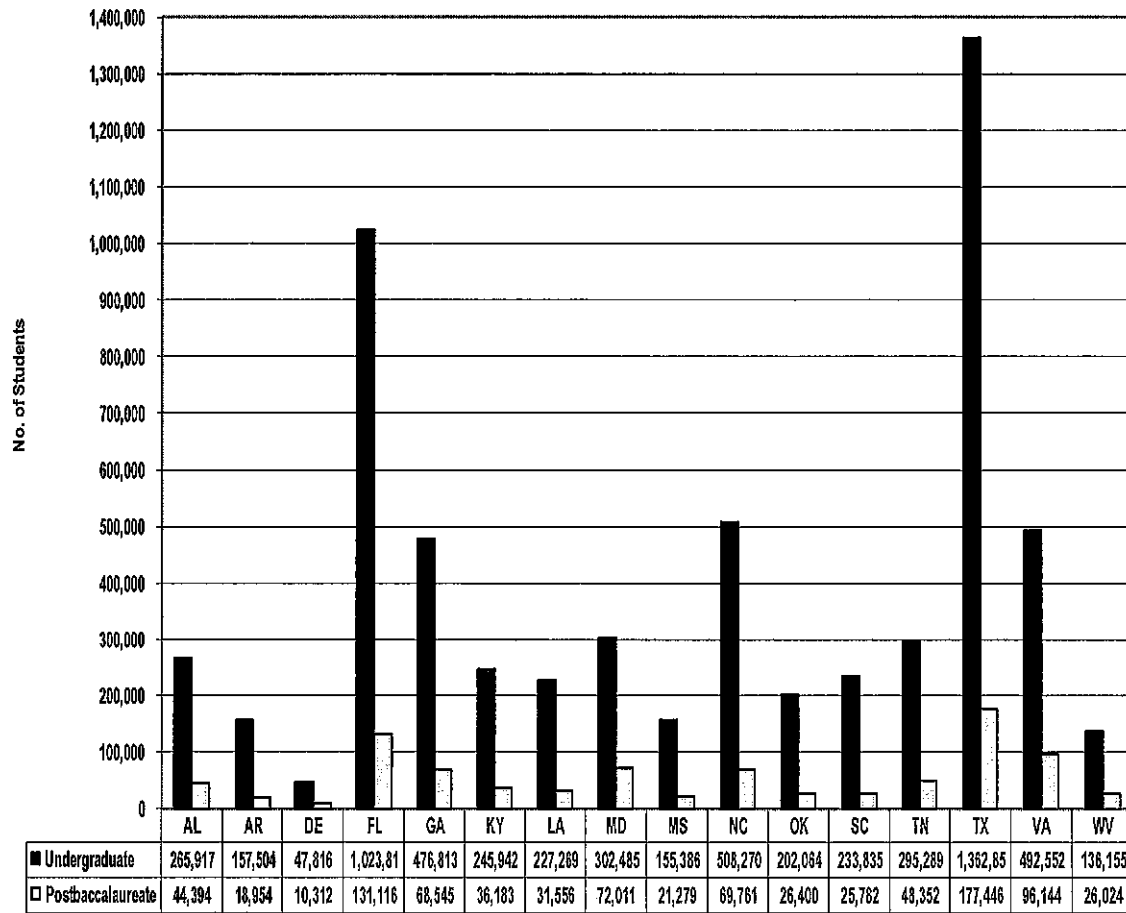

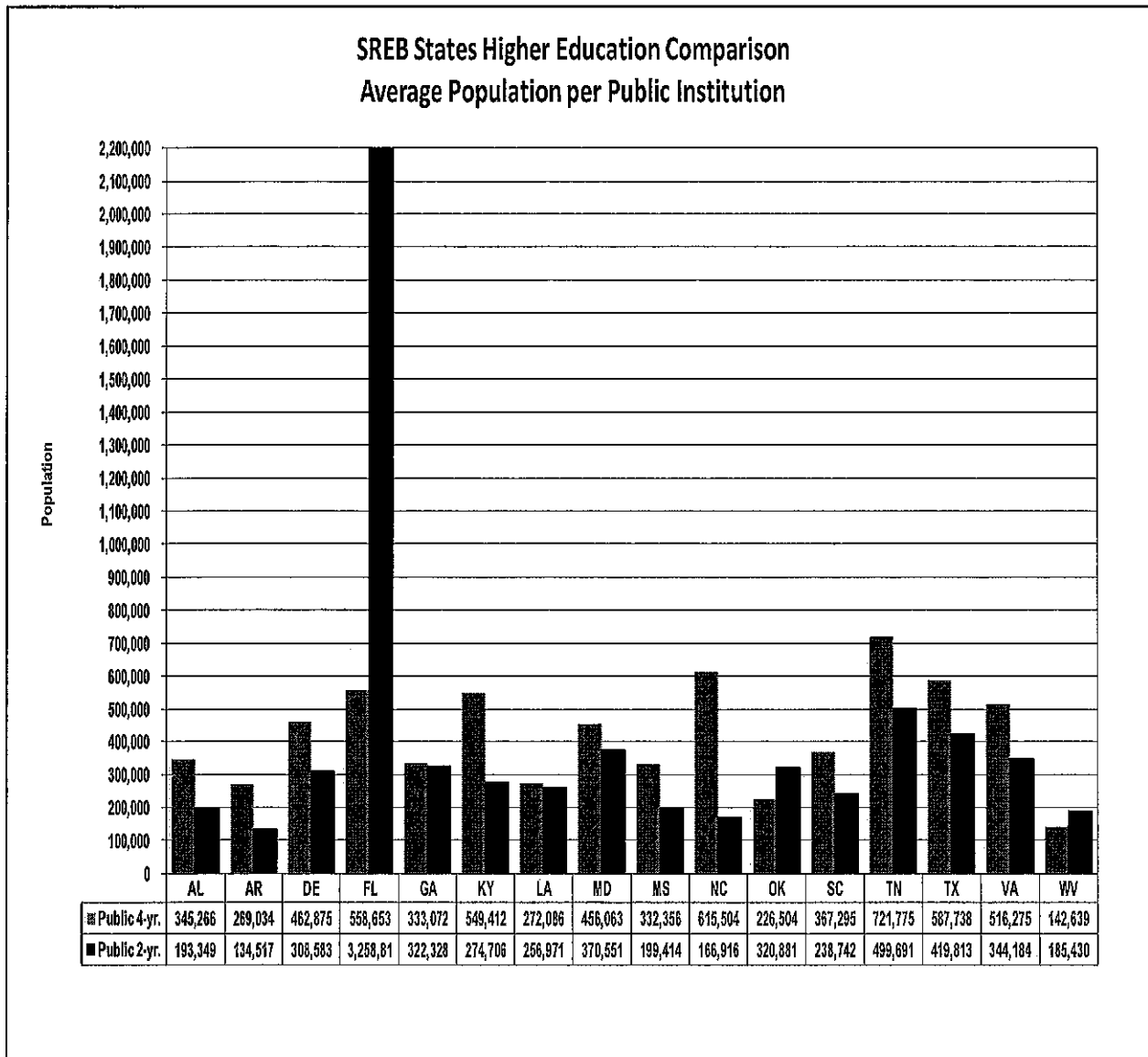

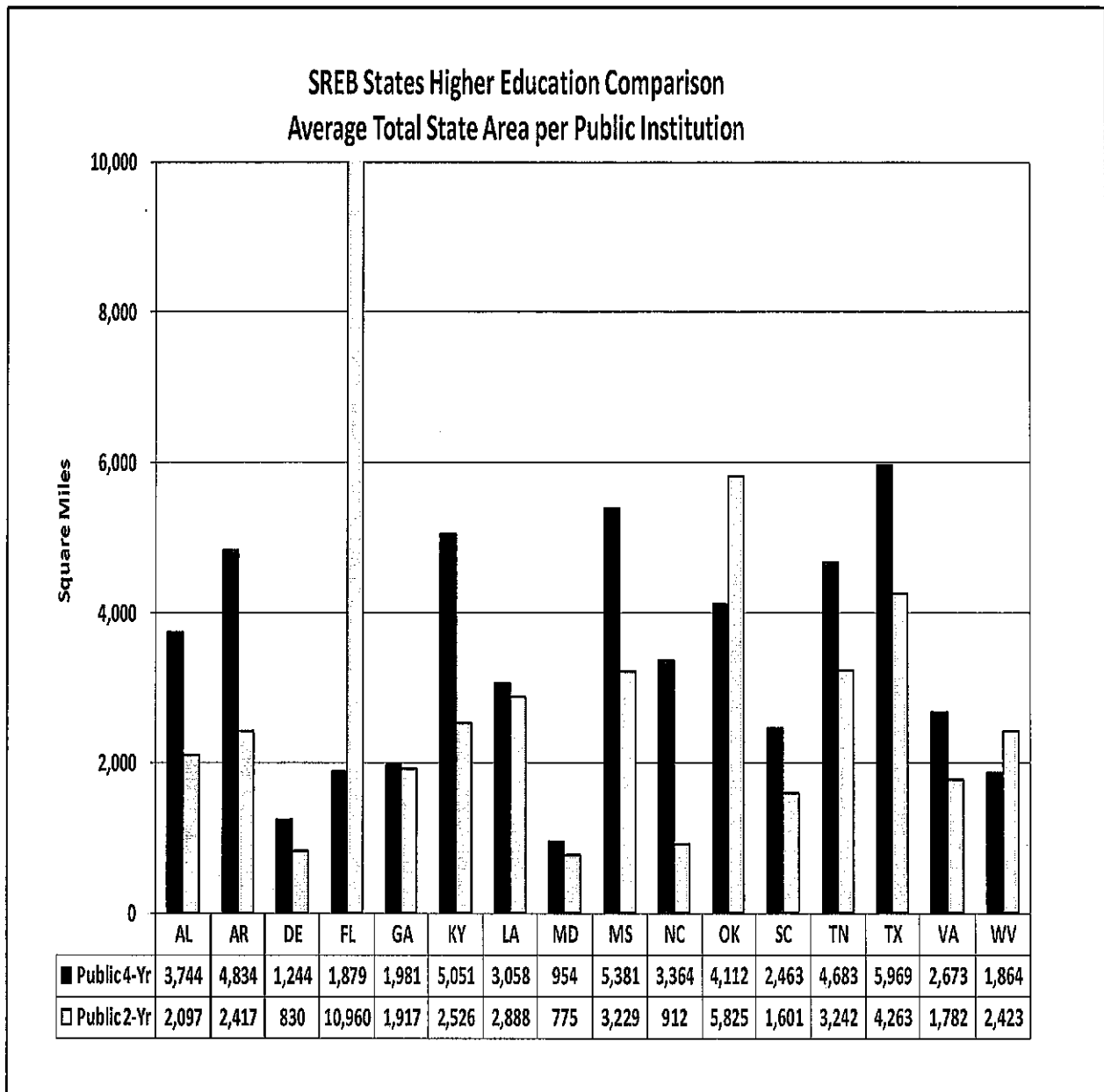

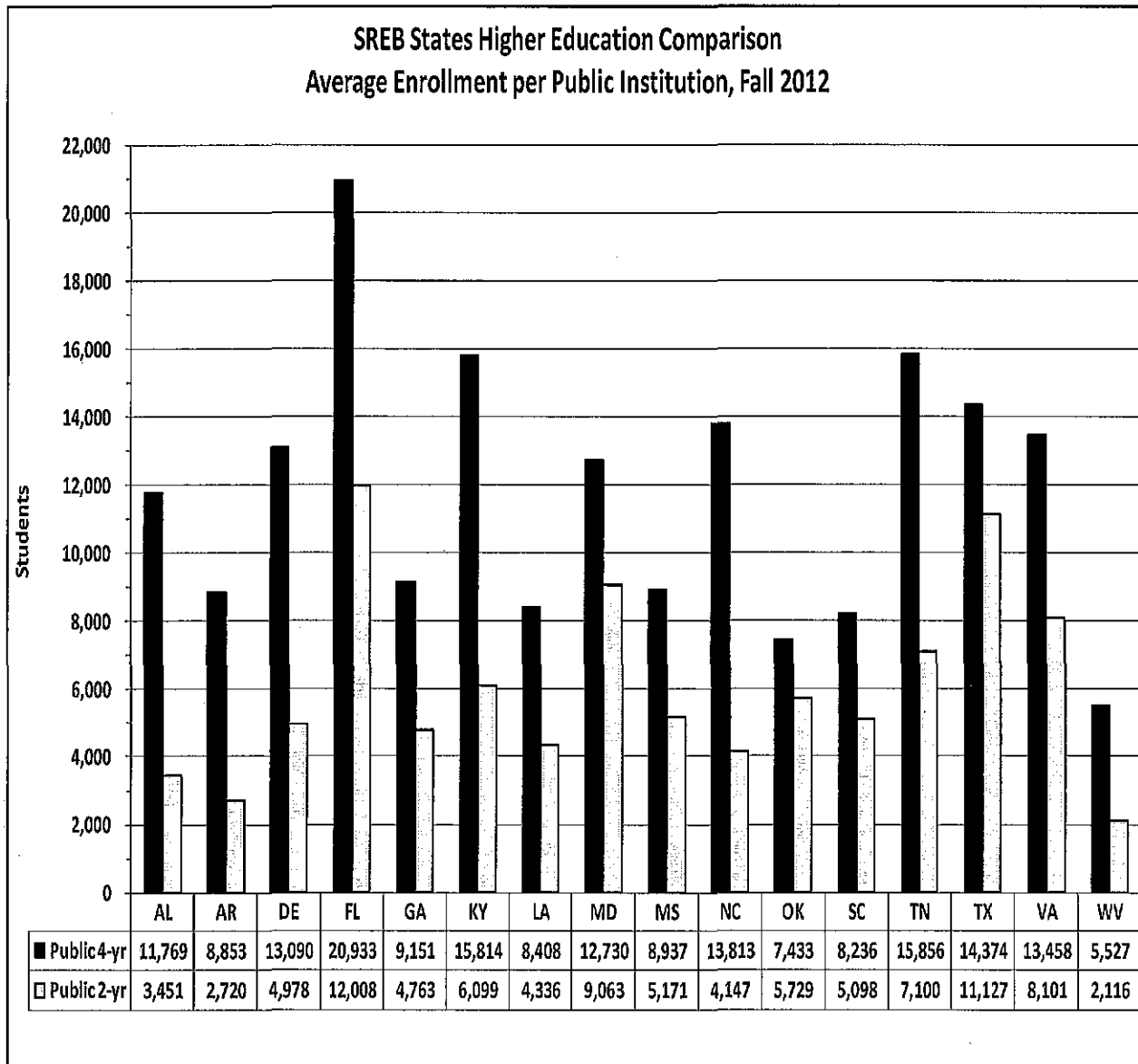

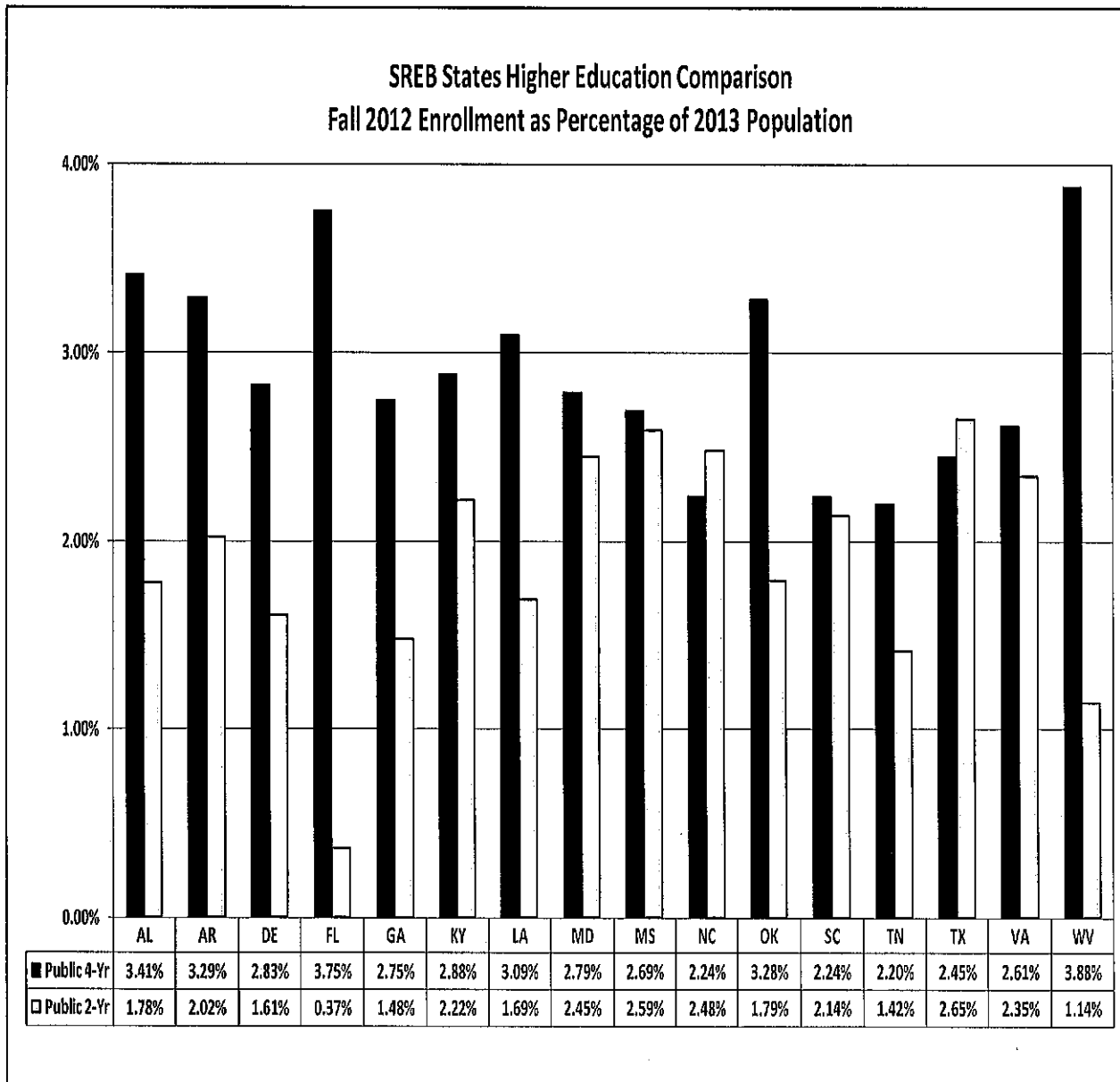

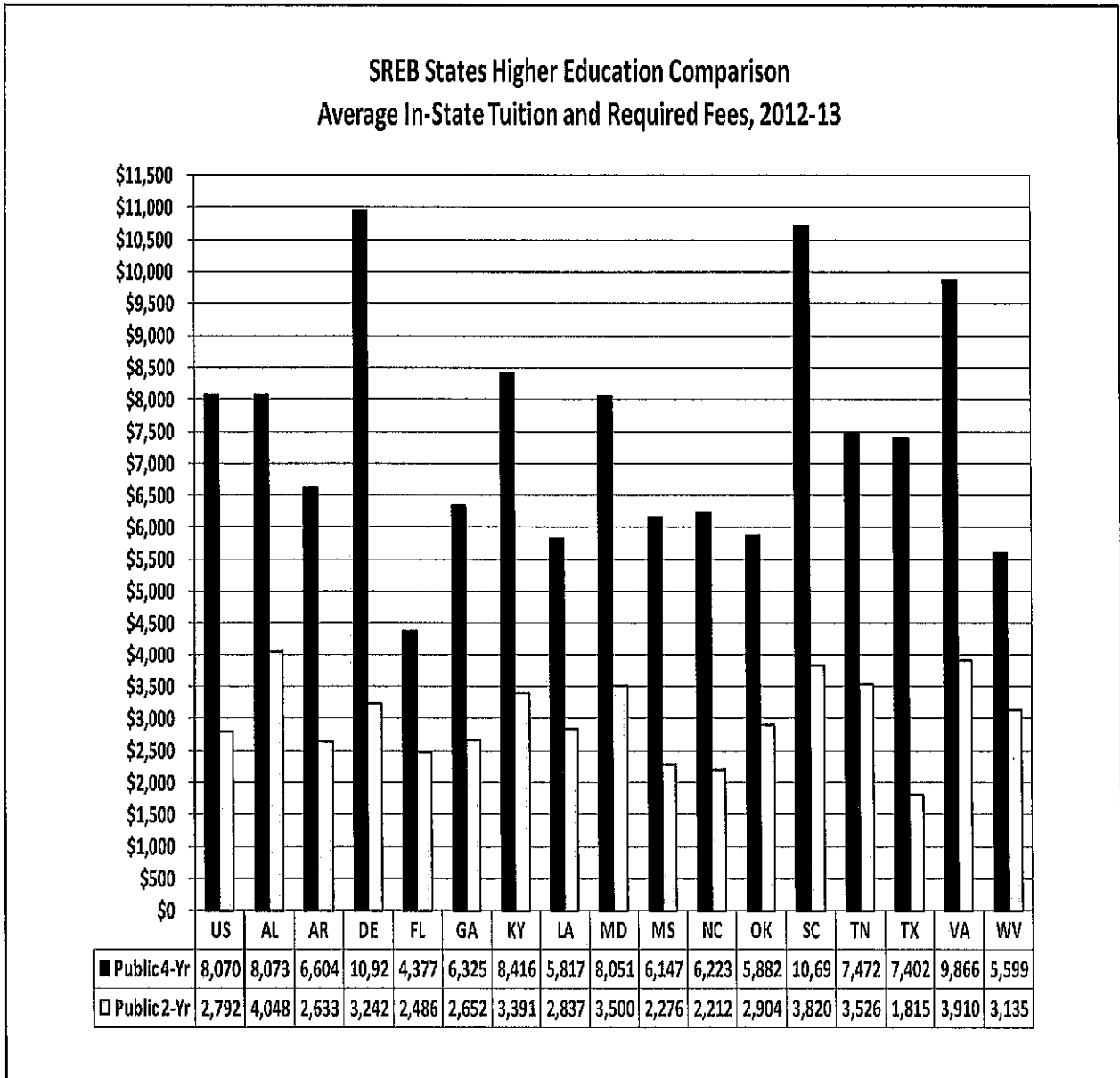

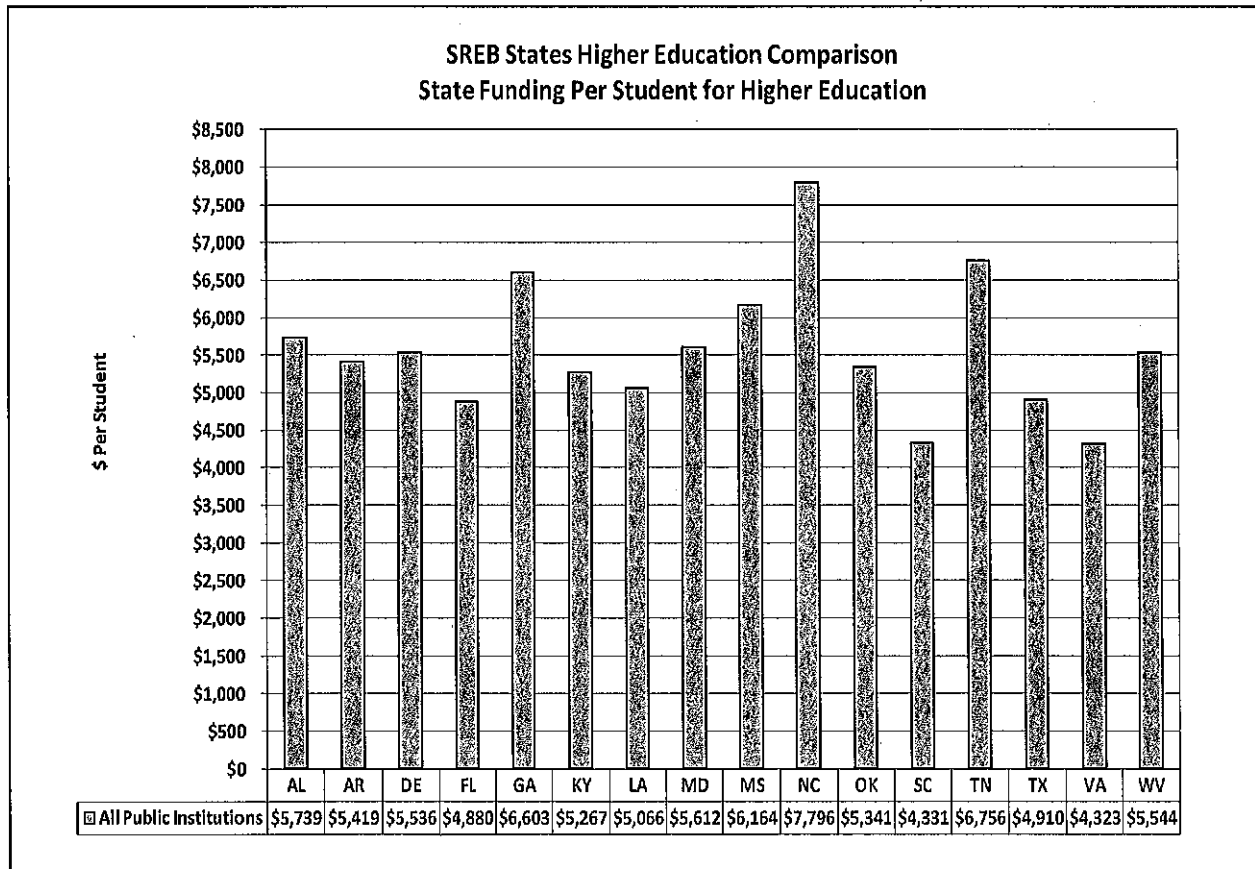
